#### **OPERATION: SAVE OUR SAILORS**

On a cold night in February 2014 two U.S. Navy Veterans were awoken by a terrifying sight: an electrical fire was burning around them. The grandfather and his daughter then woke her child and escaped from the shell which hours before was their home. The Fire Department was able to douse the flames and the family was safe, but their home was in shambles. While there was some structural harm done to the building, the structure had been fully consumed by smoke damage and was red tagged, thereby making it unlivable. Between that night in 2014 until recently the remains of the building had deteriorated and this multi-generational military family was at a loss of what to do. Losing a lifetime of memories in a single moment was difficult enough; the prospect of losing what remaining home they had left was too much



to bear. Their navy training helped save their lives and the life of the child that night but they needed help to reconstruct their home.



The City of Rancho Cucamonga reached out to Pomona Valley Habitat and together they are working with the family to rebuild what was lost. Upon his initial inspection, PVH Construction Manager, Luis Jimenez found much work needed to be done. The vegetation around the house was overgrown, there was a dilapidated shed on the property, various systems needed to be fixed, the smoke damage was extensive, and the interior was cluttered with miscellaneous items. With much help from The Grey Brigade and the ABWK team, Habitat was able to eliminate all overgrown vegetation and remove the rundown shed and various other pieces of debris. They then proceeded with a more delicate task.

If your life was changed in an instant and items that you had treasured disappeared forever, it would be completely understandable that parting with other items, even items that seem like trash to other people, could be painful. It was clear that there would need to be a definite purging of various items that had been collected over four years and the Habitat volunteers helped in the most courteous and effective way possible. The crew helped the veteran daughter sort damaged from salvageable items and then staged the items on tables outside the home so that the family could evaluate and decide to pack or purge. They then carefully packed selected items into keep pods or carefully placed other items into large trash bins. This helped alleviate stress from the family as they were reluctant to part with more than they had already been forced to lose.



The family's financial hardships and the cooperation between the city and PVH have jump started other organizations to help as well. The Home Depot Foundation has committed to giving a grant of materials to help with the reconstruction. Due



to the age of the building it needed to be tested for toxic material and thankfully Patriot Environmental Laboratory Services Inc. tested the structure at no cost and completed a AQMD report at a discount. The residence test positive for both lead and asbestos which has created the need for an abatement contractor. Elite Customs Disaster Response, owned by fellow veteran Knicko Askari, will be working at a discounted price on the abatement to keep costs at a minimum. After the abatement is completed we will begin the reconstruction project with volunteers. While this is not a Habitat house it is a partnership with the City of Rancho Cucamonga, to give back to our community and repay a well deserving veteran family.

The need does not end with this family. There are numerous veterans still living in substandard housing which is completely unacceptable. Please donate to our Salute to Service Veteran Build so that we may continue to serve those who have sacrificed for our country. No United States of America Veteran should be forced to sleep in substandard conditions. Because the Rancho Cucamonga project is NOT a Habitat project, monetary donations will not be applied to this project; however if you would like to donate to our future Veteran Pomona Valley Habitat Builds contact the La Verne office at 909.596.7098.

#### ABWK: The Dark Brush

When we last joined our valorous volunteers, the *A Brush With Kindness* Team had just completed their portion of an intensive project in the City of Ontario when a new call for help was received at the Hall of Habitat (located in La Verne at the corner of Bonita and "D"). The Brush Signal lit up the sky (and then was promptly turned off because it's too expensive and we're a non-profit) and the calls and emails for Volunteers began. Morgan Sternquist, the Volunteer and Special Events Coordinator, was looking for particular people: Volunteers of Steel - Helpers who could

paint tall buildings, who could lift small bricks, who could climb standard sized ladders, and most of all who had spare time on Saturdays.



With the Altruistic Alliance assembled, the immense enterprise ensued. The intrepid individuals pressure washed the home and back patio covering, freeing them from the plague of peeling paint. They then went about repairing stucco and replacing damaged fascia boards where consuming corrosion had struck.

The ABWK team then repaired rain gutters as well as the wrought iron gates & reattached mesh screens that had broken free. Misaligned bricks on the fence wall were realigned thwarting the ravages of time once again. The plucky platoon of patrons painted the home, the fence, bricks, and mail box too!

Disrepair was defeated once again by the daring delegation of determined do-gooders!


